

① The Passion of Christ

We ~~we~~ need tonight ^{to} come to a basic understanding of the extent of the suffering which Christ had to undergo — it does affect other lives and has application to our own lives

In (Phil. 2:5-10)

"Christ emptied Himself"

Let's try to comprehend this fact — here is where Christ's humiliation + suffering began

Let's try to imagine an accident in which we become deaf, blind, unable to speak — and a quadraplegic — neck broken, paralyzed

How anxious would you be to keep living? (Greg Know)

I But when Christ voluntarily laid aside his majesty + glory + took on a human body with all the finite limitations this was infinitely worse for Him than the accident I described — this was intense suffering for God to experience — we can't imagine what that would be like

II Then in addition Christ voluntarily laid aside the use of His divine Power — omniscience — Christ's miracles + insight + knowledge came as a result of His total dependence on the H.S., not because He was God. Christ Himself said this repeatedly (Heb. 2:17) "he became like a man in all things"

III Christ was without sin - not because His God but because He refused to sin - He was tempted by Satan & could not use His own attribute of HOLINESS to resist sin - but rather He was tempted in "all points like we are yet He didn't sin". ~~He was still~~ Heb. 9:18

IV The environment that Christ lived in was great suffering for Him. In Titus we read that "God dwells in unapproachable light - in Whom there is no darkness at all" But Christ came down into a miserable environment, even by human standards - Born in a stable, grew up in poverty, disease, in a country under the heel of the ruthless Roman empire, an era of violence, hate, sin & all of these results of our sinful rebellious planet - These things that God doesn't enjoy - He hates sin & its results. But Christ came & lived in the sinful environment of human existence - that was suffering for God. Like He said in (Jo. 17) - He longs for His natural environment of glory (mk. 9:19) - "O Wicked & perverse generation How long shall I put up w you"

Christ knew who He was & could have presented Himself as Satan tempted Him to do falling down from the pinnacle of the temple

③ Satan wanted Him to use His divine attributes + thus disqualify Himself as a human being who was going to sacrifice Himself up for us.

So the incarnation - where God put Himself in a human body on our earth was suffering for Christ

IV As He begins His ministry, He now begins to experience the hatred & rejection of fallen man. (a) rejection by his enemies - increasing hostility & hate from the religious ~~and~~ rulers, and even the multitudes

(b) his own family taunted him & did not believe

(c) now He's got the 11 disciples, but even they will scatter + leave Him

(Jo. 16:32) but at least His Father was with Him, Christ says

He was grieved as He knows that they will all leave Him - now could they even stay awake while He prayed.

(d) In (Lu. 22:39-46) we read that Christ's agony was so great that His capillaries were breaking & He was sweating blood.

He was under intense suffering as He faced 3 more terrors - each one more intense than the previous one
