Chaz Romano | I Cor. 15 - One of THE E most important
chapters in the Bible

This is the final problem in the church
at Corinth (v. 12) where ^{some of} they believed in
a spiritual resurrection but not a physical (v. 12)

(vs. 1-11)

The gospel:

- ① "Christ died for our sins" (Isa. 53, Ps. 16)
- ② "He was buried" - he did not just faint, he
actually died
- ③ "He was raised on the third day" Mt. 12
- ④ "He appeared" Paul lists six different groups
or individuals 1st degree witnesses of this
event - many of them still alive

Historical Circumstantial Evidences

v. 9-10 Paul seeing what he is - "the least"
& a "persecutor" and yet he realizes that
he is accepted, forgiven and commissioned
as an apostle through GRACE - only
God's Unmerited favor could take a
Sinner like Paul and use him.

We need, like Paul, to see that we
are ① vile sinners ② that God loves us
③ redeems us ④ and makes us into new creatures
We need to accept God's Grace - believe
what He did - & go on to serve Him
with confidence because we are accepted
& loved & re-made into new creatures

Chapter 10: The Bible
The Bible is the final problem in the church
of Britain (U.S.) which was raised in
a general conference but not logical
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Paul lived as a "new creature" - he accepted his forgiveness & functioned as an apostle - the highest position - he could have often - we would rather hold on to the fact that we are ^{GUILT} sinners, than to accept the fact that we are new creatures, forgiven & entrusted with a great commission "By the grace of God I am what I am" - we need to say it every day

(v. 12-19) - The consequences of NOT believing in Christ's bodily resurrection

- If no resurrection
 - then Christ didn't rise
 - then message of apostles & N.T. is meaningless
 - then our faith is empty
 - then our whole message is false & we are all liars
- There is NO CHRISTIANITY - with an un-resurrected Christ - & you are still in your sins - No in-between Christ is God

Since Christ rose: ① all our sins are paid for
 ② He had no personal sins
 So we are totally forgiven - all our sins are paid for.

(v. 20-28) Consequences

1st Fruits → Easter Sunday - Christ is the 1st One to rise from the dead - All the rest who are in Christ will rise at Christ's coming (+ Thess. 4:16) Then Christ rules until all authority or rule is put down - Then hands over kingdom to God Miltonner

and find a new definition for it
in order to put it on a level
that is not too high for the
average person to understand
it. It is not just a matter of
using simple words, but of
using words that are familiar
to the average person.

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④ Time clock - When the "times of the Gentiles" is over
(the church age) God will resume the last
7 yrs. & deal with the Jewish nation before
establishing His prophesied O.T. Kingdom
of Righteousness (Isa 11) TRIBULATION

If there were only this one O.T. prophecy
about Jesus its accuracy would assure
me of the absolute trustworthiness and
inspiration of the whole Bible. But there
are over 300 prophecies just about Jesus
alone. It is a miraculous Book from God!

But now Jesus turns his attention
to the next part of Daniel's prophecy
& Isaiah's in ch. 53 "The cutting-off"
I.E. his death on the Cross!

③ The rebellion will vindicate Christ and the destruction of the evil will occur as Satan is cast into hell-forever

When the last enemy of God is put down by the Lord Jesus Christ as mediator of God's Kingdom the purpose of the Kingdom will be fulfilled.

Then Christ will hand over the mediatorial (mill.) Kingdom to God to be merged into the eternal kingdom

This does not mean the end of Christ's rule - he only ceases to rule as the mediatorial King.

As the eternal second Person of the Godhead He shares the throne with the Father in the eternal Kingdom
(Rev. 22:3-5)

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
