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The Church

The church must be a community that experiences + reinforces biblical values - and we must have the strength to live antagonistic at key points to the world around us.

To succeed + live with these different values we must be a countercommunity. 1. a Christian cannot maintain Christian values in this society unless he is a part of a community that reinforces these values. If Christians don't act like Christians sooner or later they will stop believing like Christians. So our Christian community - our church is a crucial area.

In the N.T. Jesus gathered his band around him - they were a counter-cultural community + Jesus spoke out strongly to establish the fact that he + his disciples were different.

In Acts + the epistles the church - the Apostles simply repeated what Jesus had done with them. Jesus had prepared for Pentecost, + all the new believers by training a small community of people. They could handle 3000 new converts by following the example of Jesus - + with the help of the H.S.

i.e. Jesus had small groups in homes + outdoors - koinonia groups - cell groups who met for prayer, fellowship, teaching + the Lord's Supper. They not only knew how to experience community they also knew they were a distinct people.

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2) The early church had a strong countercultural consciousness - they saw themselves as neither Jew nor Gentile but something NEW - Transcending both - they were now ONE ^{Body} IN CHRIST JESUS. This was in those days a real social revolution.

Here in America most of the church is just a sub-culture, not a counter-culture.

Why? When the church fails to oppose the culture where it pays allegiance to alien gods - then the church functions simply as a sub-culture, not a counter-culture.

But if we start functioning Biblically as a countercultural community, then we will be both dynamic and love mission outreach.

We will have both a positive and a negative concept -

(1) Negatively - We take a strong stand against the surrounding culture & we have fundamental points of antithesis - e.g. against abortion, extramarital sex etc.

(2) Positively - the counterculture of our church is also positive - we offer a genuinely wonderful alternative to the world culture. We claim to be better than the world's culture by offering God's framework, His love, community.

We have answers for life-questions and solutions for personal problems.

We go on the offensive & storm the strongholds of Satan & we prevail against them. We have the answers to life.

③ The Biblical base for the Counter culture Community of the Church.

(Jo. 15:18-19) "In the world - but not of it" The tension we have to maintain as disciples of Jesus is in the world but not of it - we are not to withdraw from the world nor to become one with it. We are to maintain that ~~the~~ tension against the strong pull to a more comfortable position either out of the world or totally of the world.

That's why we have to have a (a) community & that's why we also at the same time emphasize (b) evangelism.

(Rom. 12:2) To avoid conformity to the world we have to have each other - brothers & sisters in a community.

(Lu. 12:29-32) A flock and a kingdom. What a contrast of weakness & yet strength! Jesus says by depending on him ^(Flock) we will inherit the Kingdom of God.

Having traded the values of the present world for the truth of God we become enrolled in an army: we are soldiers in a battle raging between the Kingdom of God & the powers of the enemy. It's very important for us as soldiers in God's Kingdom, to be on the offensive ~~and~~ to live & fight for the values of God & renounce the values of the world's culture.
