2 attitudes in our lives

Parable: Lu. 8:11-5 sower + seed on soils

Explains to open people - respond to truth of God's word

1. Heart that is hardened - no need (use board to show closed + open attitudes)  
Satan snatches seed away - keeps from thinking about the word

2. Rocky soil - no firm root - may have started - but still have attitude of autonomy

3. Seed among thorns - Christ has broken thru - accepted Christ = focus changed to worries, riches + pleasures of this world - gone back to closed attitude, forgetting how we came to Christ in the first place -

Side-effect - didn't let word come in + change - energy into looking good

4. Seed on good soil - honest + good heart - single-minded understanding of our purpose - focused <sup>in</sup> on Christ  
Allowing Christ to free us up + make us available to be used to bear fruit  
+ perseverance, even when our feelings - are bad

Essence of this part of film -
