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So that in reality we are praying along the same lines, about the same things and in the same Name as the H.S.

This leads us to ask ourselves How can we discover the Will of God?

(I Jo. 5: 14 & 15, Rom. 12: 2)

How can we know with certainty what is and what is not the Will of God?

Probably the simplest answer is that the answers to these questions emerge as we engage in the PRACTICE of PRAYER and not while we are studying the Theory of Prayer

But there are some practical guidelines:

1. All matters of moral & spiritual truth are clearly dealt with in the Word of God. In studying the Bible we can find in General God's will in our daily decisions

(e.g.) morals, marriage, social responsibility where the Bible speaks clearly we do not ask God if it is His will. (e.g.) don't pray about going with an unbeliever - or, even worse, marrying one. It is never God's will to do so.

2. In applying general principles to specific cases for which there is no clear Biblical guidance we are to look to the H.S. to teach us. As we pray, seeking & choosing God's will. The H.S. will restrain us or give us a deepening assurance of what is God's will in the matter
