Christmas without Christ is stale, flat,

① People use the phrase "the true meaning of Christmas" to express some vague sentiment of charity. Human goodness is a poor substitute. alternative to Immanuel - the active personal presence of "God with us". Human goodness is unstable. God is not.

② The "spirit of the Season" is a harrid getting and spending, an exchanging of gifts which by the end of Christmas Day leaves us broke, exhausted, and feeling worse than ever. Instead, ^{we need to see} Christmas is the love of God spent to redeem us from dying - and to enable us to live in His giving living love ourselves forever.

③ Without Christ in Christmas the words "Peace" and "Joy" are mere illusions. This world has never, never by its own wisdom + strength been at peace, and its joy is shattered by real life experiences of pain + death.

④ Christmas without Christ is a shell existence - hollow at the center. People living lives without meaning, nothing spiritual → no God at the center of their being. No wonder they get drunk to alter their consciousness so they don't have to face their impoverished existence.
