My wife and I first heard about the Fish House Fellowship (now called Xenos Christian Fellowship) three years ago from our son, Mike. Mike was becoming very committed to the Fellowship and we were concerned, although the changes in his life seemed good. We did not recognize the fellowship and feared that it might be a cult. Our fears were soon allayed.

If anyone has doubts about the Fish House Fellowship being a responsible Christian church, I suggest that they discover personally what it teaches and believes.
